

Big Apple Snow Globe (Revised for NYMEX)

Traders on the floor of The New York Mercantile Exchange

- 1. The actual poses and jacket designs are rough and will be refined.
- 2. Traders will be constructed out of sheets of aluminum. They will be 3D with flat elements (arms, hands) and a bit stylized and abstract. Their gestures, jackets and nametags however will be detailed (and other important elements such as the goggles worn by the interns in the pit). I will probably use high gloss model paints. I may use sheets of copper and brass as well as aluminum.

Each Trader will have a distinctive character. The sheet metal materials might remind viewers of the raw materials that are being traded. It will also lend the sculpture a sophisticated air that other materials might not - whimsical yes, perhaps reminiscent of antique tin toys, but not kooky - well constructed with a modern feeling.

- 3. Portions of the amphitheater will be made of screen to allow the air to circulate.
- 4. Flying within the globe will be the Trader's paper "Trading Forms".
- 5. The bottom half of the Apple will be painted metallic silver (on the inside), hiding the fan.
